

SECTION 11(6) OF THE FIREARMS ACT 1968

GUIDANCE

There should be a zone extending to 275 metres from the shooting point in the direction of fire, which should be clearly defined.

Shot, broken or whole clay targets should not land on any areas where the public has access or where permission from the owner of the land has not been granted.

No person who appears to be under the influence of alcohol or drugs should be allowed to shoot.

All guns should be loaded only when on the firing point.

Health and Safety regulations require that appropriate safety equipment must be made available to all parties requiring it.

The period of validity for the exemption may vary dependant on individual circumstances and you should discuss your requirements in detail with the Police Firearms Licensing Department.

Initial application for a site should be made a reasonable time before the first such event is to take place, preferably at least four weeks.

The organiser must be in a position to accept responsibility for the safety of the event(s) and should do so.

The organiser of such an event has a liability in law and is advised to have the appropriate form of insurance to cover any accidents, third party liability, employers liability, etc depending on the circumstances.
