Buckie/Keith Local Policing Update

In the Buckie and Keith areas our local Policing issues are informed by understanding what communities need through consulting, listening, responding and providing feedback.

Our strategic priorities are:

Antisocial Behaviour, Community Focus, Serious and Organised Crime and Drugs, Force Reputation and Standards, National Security, Public Protection, Road Casualty Reduction, Violence and Efficiency and Productivity.

Your Local Policing Team are focused on dealing with local issues and through research, analysis and consultation local issues have been identified within the Buckie and Keith areas.

Through our ongoing consultation and engagement with the community it is clear that the following issues are important to you.

Local Issues

1. Anti Social Behaviour

Antisocial behaviour and specifically the misuse of alcohol, underage drinking, youth annoyance and vandalism are serious concerns across our communities.

2. Road Casualty Reduction

The poor standard of driving within the town centres of Buckie and Keith, particularly involving young drivers, gives cause for concern to those who live and work in the areas.

3. Community Focus

We are regularly told that a visible police presence is important within communities to enhance community safety, well being and provide you with reassurance around the service provided by local officers.

How we will work together

We work in partnership with the other agencies, local business and community representatives to respond to the issues that concern you most. These include Moray Council, Grampian Fire and Rescue, NHS Grampian, Community Councils, Pub and Neighbourhood Watch Schemes.

This will allow us to,

- maintain the strong working relationships with Buckie High School, Keith Grammar School and their associated pre schools and primary schools and to support and contribute to the Integrated Assessment Framework development in terms of support for young people.
- provide support and advice to 'Pub Watch' and other community based efforts with the aim of reducing the number of alcohol related incidents in the Buckie area and when offenders are identified bar them from entering licensed premises in our area
- work with partners to support the Force strategic priority of Road Casualty Reduction by addressing issues of anti-social driving with a view to reducing road accident rates and improving the quality of life in our communities.
- increase the use of the Moray Mobile Police Office to raise the profile of policing in the many smaller communities in our area.
- increase our activity with Partners in relation to youth engagement, diversion and intervention schemes

What we have done so far

- Attend regularly at the 2 secondary schools in our area to promote responsible citizenship amongst young people, significantly engaging with them around the risks of alcohol and drug abuse. On 14 June 2010 the Buckie Thistle Community Alert day took place at Buckie High School. This involved a strong multi agency approach and included a production by "Out Of The Darkness" Drama Group on the effects of drug and alcohol abuse which was well received.
- Following local consultation and intelligence received regarding anti social driving Operation Monarch took place in Buckie Town Centre on Thursday 17 and Sunday 20 June 2010. This involved Buckie Local Policing Team Officers assisted by specialist Roads Policing Officers and officers from other Local Policing Teams in Moray and resulted in 40 motor cars being stopped and a total of 17 persons being reported for a variety of road traffic offences.
- In March 2010 Constable Morag Lawrence of the Buckie Local Policing Team commenced a new role which involves her supporting her colleagues at Buckie by carrying out enquiries on their behalf, the aim being to enhance the quality of service provided to the communities in and around Buckie. Constable Lawrence spends the majority of her time patrolling on foot her role has already reaped dividends in terms of public reassurance and improving visibility and accessibility.
- During this period, the Mobile Police Office has regularly been deployed in the towns and villages in our area.

What we intend to do in the next three months

In the coming months it is our intention to continue to work towards addressing the issues already identified and this is likely to involve

- continued engagement with young people with the aim of positively influencing lifestyle choices and therefore reducing anti social behaviour
- further operations throughout the Buckie/Keith Local Policing Area along the lines of Operation Monarch to target anti social driving.
- increased visibility of patrols in our communities with the continued use of the Mobile Police Office and publicised Police surgeries in our communities.

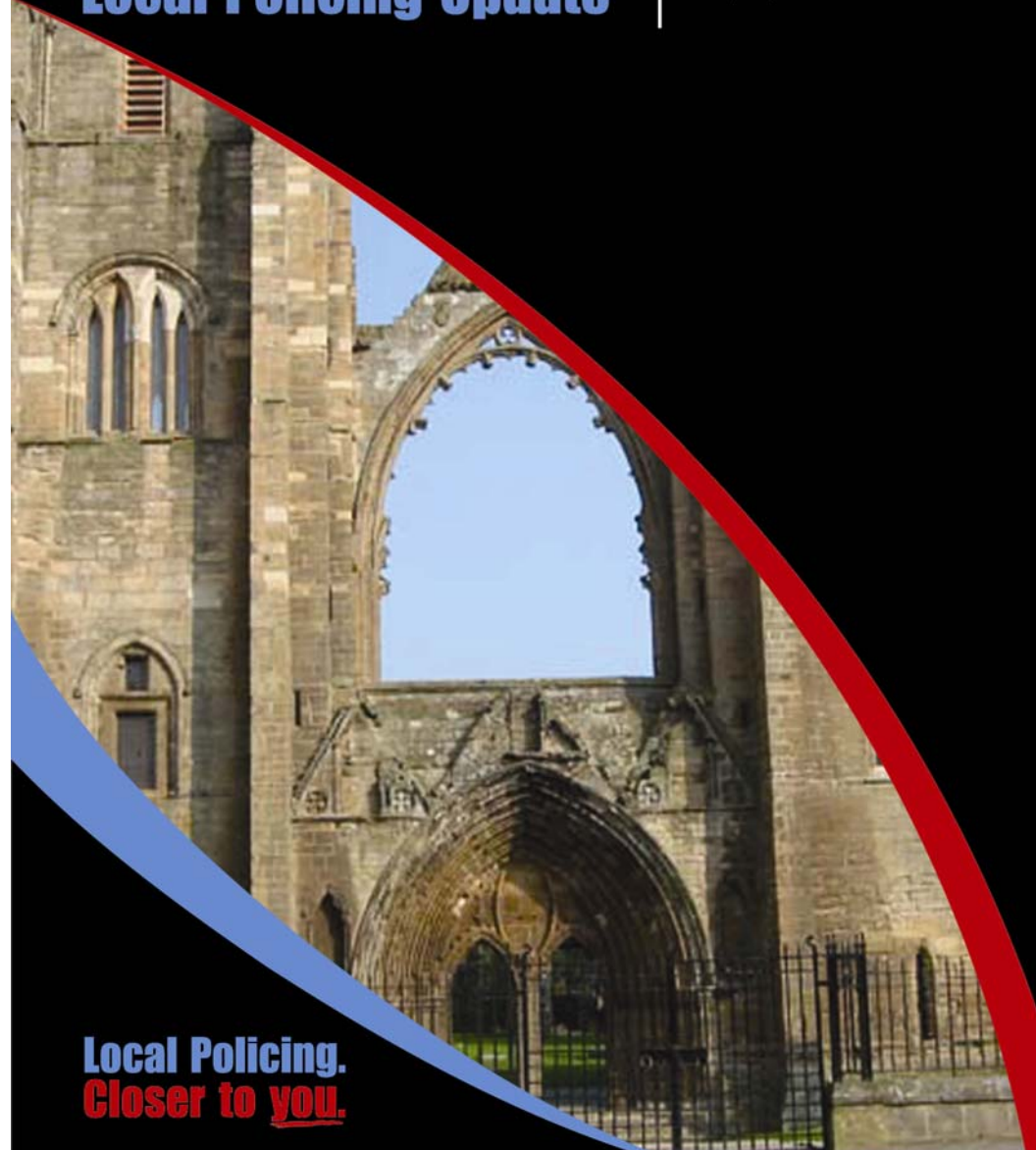

In Elgin, local Policing issues are informed by an understanding of what our communities need through consulting, listening, responding and providing feedback.

Your Local Policing Team is focused on dealing with local issues and through research, analysis and consultation, a number of local issues have been identified within the Elgin area.

It is clear that the following issues are important to you.

Local Issues

1. Anti Social Behaviour

Anti Social behaviour and specifically the misuse of alcohol, underage drinking, youth annoyance and vandalism are serious concerns across our communities.

2. Shoplifting

Shoplifting impacts on many of the retail premises within our town. Whilst we deal with a number of shoplifting offences, we believe many others are not reported to the Police.

3. Community Focus

We are regularly told that a visible police presence is important within communities to enhance community safety, well being and provide you with reassurance around the service provided by local Officers.

How we will work together

We work in partnership with the other agencies, local business and community representatives to respond to the issues that concern you most. These include Moray Council, Grampian Fire and Rescue, NHS Grampian, Community Councils, Pub, Shop and Neighbourhood Watch Schemes, Elgin BIDS and many more.

This will allow us to,

- maintain the strong working relationships with Elgin High School, Elgin Academy and their seven associated feeder Primary Schools, ensuring that we support young people.
- provide support and advice to 'Pub Watch' and other community based efforts with the aim of reducing the number of alcohol related incidents in the Elgin area and when offenders are identified, bar them from entering licensed premises in our area.
- work with partners to improve integration of services in communities. We will maintain and develop our work within the NEON joint service based at Bezack Street, New Elgin, where we already work with other Community Planning Partners.
- provide support and attend the local Community Council meeting and other community based efforts with the aim of listening to and acting on your concerns, and then telling you what we have done about them.
- increase our activity with partners in relation to youth engagement, diversion and intervention schemes.

What we have done so far

We have directed specific patrols to areas known to be frequented by young people for drinking alcohol. Operation Avon is a partnership approach to tackling substance misuse, predominately alcohol and is aimed at early intervention and to protect young people and minimise any resulting anti social behaviour in the community. We have carried out a number of Operation Avons in the Local Policing Area during this period.

We have carried out an operation on shoplifters within Asda and Tesco. We work closely with many other stores within Elgin Centre, and support the Shop Watch scheme. Several Officers now carry the responsibility for assisting retail stores in their efforts to prevent this crime, and initiatives are being progressed for enhancing the detection of offenders.

Two Officers have been working in partnership with the NEON Family Service in New Elgin, nurturing closer links with community partners with the aim of strengthening our commitment to a more 'joined up approach' to individual and community needs.

Further Officers have been allocated to Elgin Central and Elgin North.

In addition to this all Elgin Officers have been allocated specific community responsibilities.

Although there is a large Police Office in Elgin, the Mobile Police Office has been deployed at various locations in Elgin including the car park at Asda.

What we intend to do in the next three months

In the coming months it is our intention to continue to work towards addressing the issues already identified and this is likely to involve,

- further operations targeting underage drinking in conjunction with our partners.
- continued engagement with our retail partners with a view to enhancing security arrangements, crime prevention and detection of offenders.
- increasing the visibility of patrols, increasing the number of officers authorised to use police cycles, and ensuring that the officers allocated to Elgin South, Elgin Central and Elgin North are provided with an opportunity to spend time in their areas.

Crucially, we must continue to consult, listen and respond to the issues which are important to you and then tell you what we have done.

LOSSIEMOUTH AND FOCHABERS Local Policing Update

In Lossiemouth and Fochabers, local Policing issues are informed by understanding what our communities need through consulting, listening, responding and providing feedback.

Your Local Policing Team are focused on dealing with local issues and, through research, analysis and consultation, three main issues have been identified within your communities.

It is clear that the following issues are important to you.

Local Issues

1. Anti Social Behaviour

Antisocial behaviour in general but particularly around alcohol, underage drinking, youth annoyance, vandalism and antisocial driving are serious concerns across our communities.

2. Road Casualty Reduction

Inconsiderate driving within Lossiemouth, particularly by young drivers gives cause for concern to those who live in the areas affected by this.

3. Community Focus

We are often told that a visible police presence is important within communities to enhance community safety, well being and provide you with reassurance around the service provided by local Officers.

How we will work together

We work in partnership with the other agencies, local business and community representatives to respond to the issues that concern you most. These include Moray Council, Grampian Fire and Rescue, NHS Grampian, Community Councils, Shop, Pub and Neighbourhood Watch Schemes.

This will allow us to,

- maintain the strong working relationship with Lossiemouth High School, Milne's High School and their associated Pre-School and Primary Schools, ensuring that we support young people.
- provide support and advice to 'Pub Watch' and other community based efforts with the aim of reducing the number of alcohol related incidents in the Local Policing Area.
- work with partners to support the Force strategic priority of Road Casualty Reduction by addressing issues of anti-social driving with a view to reducing road accident rates and improving the quality of life in our communities.
- provide support and attend all local Community Council meetings and other community based efforts with the aim of listening to and acting on your concerns, and then telling you what we have done about them.
- increase the use of the Moray Mobile Police Office to reach out and raise the profile of Policing in the many smaller communities in our area.
- increase our activity with Partners in relation to youth engagement, diversion and intervention schemes.

What we have done so far

We attend regularly at the 2 Secondary Schools in our area to speak about good citizenship amongst young people, significantly engaging with them around the risks of alcohol and drug abuse. Pupils at Lossiemouth High School are working on a drama project that will provide information to pupils and parents on internet safety.

Following local consultation, in conjunction with Roads Policing Officers in Moray we have carried out a number of intensive patrols tackling anti-social driving.

In December 2009 Constable George Ogg of the Fochabers Local Policing Team was instated as the dedicated officer for Lhanbryde and surrounding communities. He carries out frequent foot patrols, speaks to residents, attends the Lhanbryde Community Surgery and visits the Primary School.

In January 2010 Constable Angela Savage took up her new role as the Hopeman beat officer, looking after Burghead, Roseisle, Cummington, Hopeman and Duffus. She attends community meetings and takes ownership for anti social and criminal issues occurring within the communities.

All Officers in the Local Policing Area have been allocated responsibility for specific areas of our communities with responsibility to carry out foot patrols and engage with residents. These have been dubbed "micro-beats".

During this period the Mobile Police Office has regularly been deployed in our villages across the Local Policing Area.

What we intend to do in the next three months

In the coming months it is our intention to continue to work towards addressing the issues already identified and this is likely to involve,

- continued engagement with young people with the aim of positively influencing lifestyle choices and therefore reducing anti social behaviour.
- further high profile patrols and intelligence led operations in the Lossiemouth Local Policing Area to target anti social driving.
- increased visibility of patrols in our communities with the continued use of the Mobile Police Office and publicised Police surgeries in our communities.
- further activity by local officers in their allocated micro-beats.

Crucially, we must continue to consult, listen and respond to the issues which are important to you and then tell you what we have done.

FORRES AND SPEYSIDE Local Policing Update

In the areas of Forres and Speyside, local Policing issues are informed by an understanding of what our communities need through consulting, listening, responding and providing feedback.

Your Local Policing Team is focused on dealing with local issues and through research, analysis and consultation, local issues have been identified within the Forres and Speyside area.

It is clear that the following issues are important to you.

Local Issues

1. Anti Social Driving

Antisocial Driving, specifically young drivers, causing a nuisance in Forres town centre, driving irresponsibly and placing themselves and others at risk.

2. Underage Drinking

This issue appears is a problem across the Local Policing Area, with youngsters gathering in public parks at weekends consuming alcohol, causing a disturbance and damaging property.

3. Community Focus

You have told us that that a visible police presence is important within communities to enhance community safety, well being and provide you with reassurance.

How we will work together

We work in partnership with the other agencies, local business and community representatives to respond to the issues that concern you most. These include Moray Council, Grampian Fire and Rescue, NHS Grampian, Community Councils, Pub and Neighbourhood Watch Schemes.

This will allow us to,

- maintain the strong working relationships with Forres Academy and Speyside High School and their associated feeder Primary Schools, ensuring that we support young people.
- support initiatives, including 'Pub Watch' and other community based efforts with the aim of reducing the number of alcohol related incidents in the area and when offenders are identified, bar them from entering licensed premises in our area.
- provide support and attend all local Community Council meetings and other community based efforts with the aim of listening to and acting on your concerns, and then telling you what we have done about them.
- work with partners to improve integration of services in communities. We will maintain and develop our work within the Local Management Groups and with other Community Planning Partners.
- increase our activity with partners in relation to youth engagement, diversion and intervention schemes.

What we have done so far

We have carried out an operation targeting anti social driving with support from our colleagues in Roads Policing. The operation included providing education and advice to young drivers as well as reporting incidents. Local media were involved with the initiative. Local Officers have been working with the drivers to encourage them to recognise the problem and address their driving.

We have directed specific patrols to areas known to be frequented by young people for drinking alcohol. Operation Avon is a partnership approach to tackling substance misuse, predominately alcohol and is aimed at early intervention and to protect young people and minimise any resulting anti social behaviour in the community. We have carried out a number of Operation Avons in the Local Policing Area during this period.

Officers based in the area have been given ownership of their own beats to allow the community to get to know their own officer. The Officers will undertake footpatrols in their areas and enhance police visibility.

During this past three months, the Mobile Police Office has regularly been deployed throughout across the Local Policing Area to provide rural communities with a Police surgery.

What we intend to do in the next three months

We will continue to work towards addressing the issues already identified and this is likely to involve,

- continued work to deal with anti social driving.
- further operations targeting underage drinking in conjunction with our partners.
- increasing the visibility of local officers, increasing the number of foot patrols, and ensuring that the officers allocated to beat areas are provided with an opportunity to service their areas.

Crucially, we must continue to consult, listen and respond to the issues which are important to you and then tell you what we have done.
